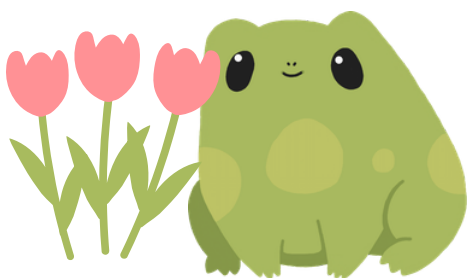

Abbreviations



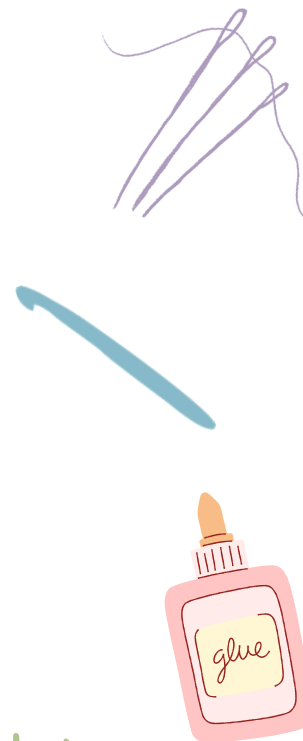
- mr - magic ring
- sc - single crochet
- dc - double crochet
- hdc - half double crochet
- st - stitch(es)
- R - round(s)
- ch - chain
- sl st - slip stitch
- dec - decrease
- inc - increase
- cc - color change
- FO - fasten off
- BO (N) - bobble stitch, pulled through with (N) loops on hook



Materials

- Preferred yarn and colors
- Thinner Yarn for embroidery
- Preferred hook (I used 4mm & 3.5mm)
- Safety eyes (I used 5mm & 8mm)
- Stuffing
- Yarn needle
- Stitch marker
- Scissors
- Glue for glueing the eyes on

(Glue is not a must, a non glue version is possible)



The yarn I used

Chenille Yarn

"Honey Bunny"

Light Pink - for the petals

"YarnArt Dolce"

Green - for the Froggy

"Alize Velluto"

Green - for the Flowerhat Froggy

"Toucan Fine"

Yellow & White for the flower

"Frida's 6te"

Green - for the Baby Froggy

"Friends Cotton 8/4"

Black - for embroidery



yarn weight super bulky
I used a 4mm hook

yarn weight medium
I used a 3.5mm hook

Froggy:

R1: 8sc in mr (8)

R2: 8inc (16)

R3: 6sc, BO (4), 5sc, BO (4), 3sc (16)

R4-R6: sc around (16) (3 rounds)

R7: 4sc, BO (3), sc, BO (3), 6sc, BO (3), sc, BO (3) (16)

R8: 8dec (8)

- glue the eyes onto the top BO
- If you don't want to glue them on, place them between R3 & R4, right under the BO, example pic down below

- stuff
- FO, close the hole and hide tail

You may have to adjust the BO for the legs due to tension or yarn type. Just be sure the front BO/the front leg is right behind the eye



Petal Froggy:

Follow the "Froggy" pattern until you come to the end of R5

- cc to petal color

R6: in FLO: ch2, dc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st into the next st, sc in the next st (repeat this sequence until the end of the round, you should have about 8 petals)

end the round with a sl st into the first stitch you made

- cc back to body color

in BLO: sc around (16)

- finish the frog by following the "Froggy" pattern - you're now at R7

place a stitch marker in the first BLO to find them easier later



no glue eye placement





Baby Froggy:

R1: 5sc in mr (5)

R2: 5inc (10)

R3: 2sc, BO (4), 2sc, BO (4), 4sc (10)

R4-R5: sc around (10) (2 rounds)

R6: sc, BO (3), BO (3), 4sc, BO (3), BO (3), sc (10)

R7: 5dec (5)

- glue eyes onto the top BO
- If you don't want to glue them on, place them between R2 & R3, right under the BO, example pic on previous page

- stuff
- If you want to use the frog as a hat, leave a long tail for sewing
- FO, close the hole



You may have to adjust the BO for the legs due to tension or yarn type. Just be sure the front BO/the front leg is right behind the eye



Flower:

starting in yellow:

R1: 6sc in mr, cc in the last st to white, sl st to close the mr

R2: ch2, 2dc into 2nd ch from hook, sl st into the next st

repeat 5x for a total of 6 petals, make a sl st into the first st you made

FO, wave in ends, leave a long tail for sewing



Assembling & finishing details

Froggies:

- Embroider a mouth between the eyes of the frog for example a "V" shape or a little smile
- Add blush if you like



Flower:

sew the flower onto the head of the froggy



Baby Froggy:

sew the baby froggy onto the head of the froggy
